

Profiles of Grangefield School Governors

Colin Peacy (Chair of Governors LA)

Colin is Chair of Governors and also a member of the Resources, Curriculum and Community committees. He was appointed a parent governor when the school opened in Sept 2000 and became a Local Authority governor in Sept 2012. Colin's family have always lived in Bishops Cleeve. His wife, Alison, is a primary school teacher and his two children attend Cleeve School, both having been pupils at Grangefield School. Colin graduated from Plymouth with a degree in Environmental Science, trained with Hazelwoods and is the financial controller for Cotswold Collections Ltd, a Cheltenham based mail order company.



Simon Edwards (Vice Chairman, Parent Governor)
