Performance:

EYFS (2015) – All disadvantaged children achieved a good level of development.

Phonic screening (2015) – 66% of PP children achieved 'working at'.

FS-KS1 (2015) – 100% of PP children made at least expected progress in reading, writing and maths. DA children all attend L2b+ in all areas.

KS1-KS2 (2015) – 100% of children achieved 2 levels progress in reading & writing, 75% in maths. 50% of PP children made 2 levels + progress in writing and maths, 25% in reading.

All DA children attained at least L4 in all areas.
