
### Science Festival Report by Archie & Sam




### Shoesday Tuesday and Wheely Wednesday

Well done to Emilia in Year 5 and Pippa in Year 1B – they were both winners of the design a poster for our summer fair. The posters will be displayed around the village.




### Where's Wally Exhibition
