Very exciting news from Bishops Cleeve Care Home. The children's work has also inspired the names of the suites in the care home and they will be named as follows:

- **Foster Suite** - After Eric Foster who was a local councillor and inspired the Great Escape.
- **St Michael's Suite** – After the Church, this is an excellent connection to the Local People and has featured a lot in the history and the stories presented, many people are connected to it and it fits lovely with our image on that suite.
- **Captain Sir Tom Suite** – After recent events we thought that we should do our bit to honour the difference he has made.
- **Tithe Suite** – The Tithe Barn has been a common choice for the children to research and it is such a brilliant community building with lots of history. It has connected the local people across generations, and still does to this day.

### School Dinners

From March 8<sup>th</sup>, Caterlink, our caterers, will provide a hot lunch from our school kitchen for some children. Because of the logistics of serving the meals in a safe environment hot meals will only be possible for:

- Children in receipt of a universal free school meal. This is free to all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year2 who wish to take up the offer.
- Children in receipt of a free school meal in any year group.
- Children in Key Stage Two who, every week, have a meal at least 4 or 5 days in a week. Unfortunately, we cannot accommodate 'peak' days (such as Wednesday Roast Day or Friday fish day) for Key Stage Two children who do not regularly have a meal.

*Just a reminder...* If your child has any of the following symptoms please keep your child off school and at home. You will need to get a test for your child.

- A new continuous cough
- A high temperature
- A complete loss or change of smell or taste

**If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19, they must not come to school and should remain at home from the day the symptoms started for the next 10 full days. Anyone with symptoms will be eligible for testing and this can be arranged via <https://www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test> or by calling 119. All other household members who remain well, must stay at home and not leave the house for 10 days. This includes anyone in your ‘Support Bubble’.**
