## **General Housekeeping**

- Please ensure that you let us know if you have any changes to your mobile phone numbers, email addresses or personal details so that we can keep our database up to date.
- Please can only water be put into the bottles brought in for during the day.
- Please ensure all your child's belongings are clearly labelled.
- All children must bring in their coats even if the day starts out sunny.
- If your child is being picked up by another parent or adult regularly, please give a list of people you are happy for your child to go home with to your teacher.

#### **School Grounds at Home Time**

Children MUST NOT be playing on any of the play equipment at pick up. This includes the play equipment on the astroturf outside the Reception classroom, the trim trail, wooden play pieces around the playground and the gym equipment by the bike shed. Please leave the school grounds promptly with your children, as Mrs Stickings, our Site Manager, needs to secure the gates for After School clubs. Children should not be climbing / walking along with wall by the kitchen. Please can children not ride their bike within the school grounds.

#### **New Start Time**

A reminder that the gates are open between 8:35 and 8:45, children arriving after the gates have closed will need to enter the school via the School Office.

We appreciate that by reducing the window of entry, this has made entering the approach road slightly busier. We are monitoring the situation over this half term. If possible, to reduce traffic flow, please consider walking, scooting or cycling to school.

#### Important – Year Six transition to Secondary School

You should have receive a letter via your child with details of the transition. You must make your application electronically by no later than the date on the letter. This is extremely important as any applications received after this date may not be considered until after March 2024. Please do look at secondary school websites for schools you are interested in your child attending after Grangefield in order to find out when their open session days are.

#### **School Dinners**

Key Stage 2 parents – please make sure you pay your dinner money regularly. We have a number of accounts in debt. We have sent debt notifications via ParentPay to anyone with a debt greater than £5 today. We are no longer able to let the total debt go beyond £5 (this is the equivalent of two school meals) and if this does happen, you will need to bring in a packed lunch for your child until the debt is paid. Key Stage 2 children (Year 3-6) are more than welcome to bring in some fruit for snack time at break. In Reception and KS1 fruit is provided.

Children who prefer to bring a packed lunch to school, are encouraged to bring a healthy lunch box. It should not contain fizzy drinks, chocolate bars or sweets. Children can bring in crisps, chocolate covered biscuits or wafers. Lunchboxes should also be free from nuts and nut based products, we have members of the school with severe allergies which require EPI-PENS.

#### **Absences due to Illness**

If your child is absent from school due to illness, please contact the school office in the first instance, on either <a href="mailto:admin@grangefield.gloucs.sch.uk">admin@grangefield.gloucs.sch.uk</a> or 01242 671003. You can still message teachers on Class Dojo, but please be aware that the teachers will not always look at messages prior to school, so you may be contacted by the office if they have not had notification about your child's absence. We ask that all parents adhere to the 48 hour rule following a bout of sickness and diarrhoea. #### **Medical Appointments**

Where possible, these should be made outside of school hours, however, we understand that this is not always easy, especially with hospital appointments. Please advise the school office, so that it can be recorded correctly in the register.

## **Other Absences**

No family holiday, short break or day out can be authorised, except in exceptional circumstances. Absence for any reason during term time is discouraged. Parents do not have an automatic right to withdraw pupils from school for a holiday and in law, have to apply for permission in advance (at least 2 weeks' notice); this should done by completing a "Request for a Leave of Absence" Form, this can be obtain from the school office. All unauthorised absences over 10 sessions (5 school days) are reported to the Local Authority Attendance Officer, which may result in you receiving a Penalty Notice. Please refer to our Absence Policy on our website for further clarification.

#### **Nasal Flu Immunisations**

The School Nurse Team will be here on 24 and 25 October to carry out the Nasal Flu Immunisation programme. Thank you to everyone who has returned the consent form so far. If you are yet to do so, please do by 2 October. The School Nurses need consent forms from everyone even those would wish to decline the immunisation. If you have misplaced your form, please contact the school office, who will be able to supply another form.




