English

We will be kicking off Spring 1 with a Journey Tale in Talk for Writing. We have taken an extract from Eva Ibbotson's beautiful novel, 'A Journey to the River Sea' and will be focusing on setting description by drawing upon our knowledge of metaphors, similes and varying sentence openers, as well as introducing personification and using our senses. In Spring 2, we will be working on 'Persuasion Texts' and this will be linked to our Geographical project about the continent of America, as well as Science, 'Living Things and Their Habitats'.

Maths

In Maths, we'll be moving on to formal Multiplication and Division methods and then onto Fractions as well as Decimals and Percentages. Fluency sessions will continue three times a week.

You can help at home by practicing times tables regularly, including accessing Times Table Rock Star and revising place value, factors, prime numbers and square numbers as well as ensuring homework is completed on time.

Across The Curriculum

We will be studying the continent of America during this term's project, looking at human and physical features and drawing comparisons with our own country, starting with North America, then on to South America and focusing in on Brazil, which will link to our Science topic of Living Things and Their Habitats.

Continuing with our South American theme, the children will be covering Samba in their music lessons and also be exploring Neo-pop art inspired by Brazilian artist Romero Britto for Art.

In Computing, the children will be learning to code and to create their own website based on what they have learnt this term. We move on to Dreams and Goals in PSHE during Spring 1 where we look at aspirations for the future and in Spring 2, we cover the Healthy Me topic, looking at ways to keep ourselves healthy physically and mentally.
