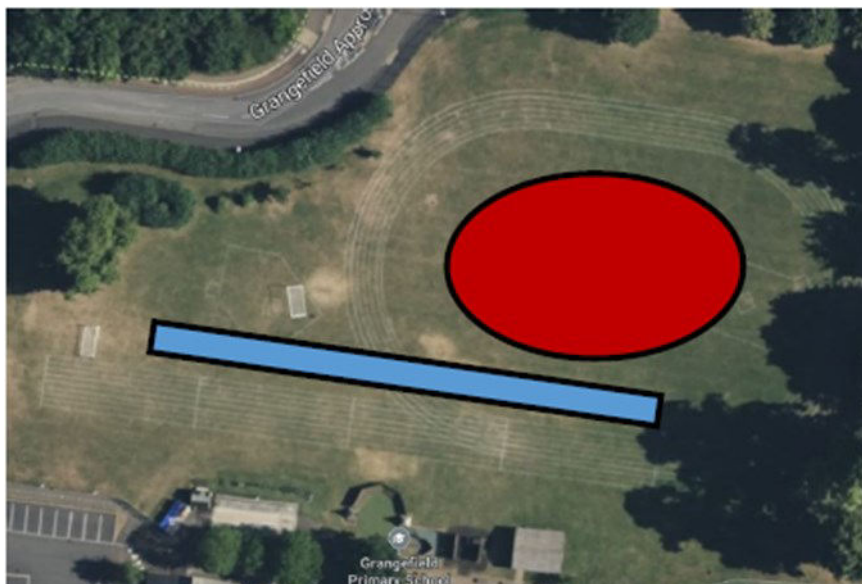
On Thursday 9th July, the children will spend the morning with their new teacher in their new classroom.

Revised Sports Days—Wednesday 1 July (EYFS & KS1) and Friday 3 July (KS2)

We have now finalised our timings for our Sports Days. Gates will be open at 12:50pm and will close again at 1:10pm. With races starting at 1:15pm. Gates will re-open at 3pm at the end of the Sports Day.

As per last year, we have changed the location of the spectator area. For Wednesday, the spectator area is now on the inner side of the straight track, indicated in blue on the map and for Thursday, the spectator area is now within the circular track, indicated in red on the map. Children will be on the field between the track and the playground.



Although, the weather is looking cooler for next week, we want to remind you that, unfortunately, there will be no or very limited shade or shelter in the spectator areas, so bring hat / small umbrella, along with a chair or blanket to sit on.

Due to safeguarding, there will be no access to the school buildings. Please do not wander around the school grounds, or let younger children play on the play equipment.

Parking can be at a premium during events, so please park considerably, avoid parking over dropped kerbs and blocking pedestrian access. If parking in neighbouring streets we ask that you park responsibly, ensuring that drive-ways and access points are not blocked. This will help maintain a safe environment for everyone and allow the wider community to go about their day without undue stress. If you can, consider leaving the car at home and walking to help relive the parking pressure around the school.

Parking

Please only enter the school car park if you have been given prior permission from the school office. Please only park in the disabled space outside the school gates if you are a blue badge holder.

- If your child suffers with Hayfever, please ensure that they are given symptom relievers before arriving at school
- Sunhats should be brought in for children to wear during outside activities

School Grounds Safety

Please be careful when entering / exiting the school grounds, please stick to paths, entering through the pedestrian gates, do not across the staff car park. Please dismount bicycles before entering the gates to the school grounds.

Children MUST NOT be playing on the play equipment during pick up time, this includes the play equipment on the astroturf outside the Reception and KS1 classrooms, the trim trail, wooden play pieces around the playground and gym equipment by the bike shed.

Please leave the school grounds promptly with your children, as Mrs Stickings needs to secure the gates for after school clubs.

E-scooter know the law

We understand that buying an e-scooter can be tempting, especially as you can get them from many popular retailers.

However the current law is clear

You can buy one but you can't ride it on a UK public road, cycle path or pavement. The only place an e-scooter can be used is on private land.

Why is this?

E-scooters are classified as Personal Light Electric Vehicles (PLEVs), so they are treated as motor vehicles and subject to the same legal requirements, such as: MOT, Licensing, Tax and Insurance.

What happens if I am stopped by Police?

Section 165A of the Road Traffic Act 1988, allows the Police to seize any motor vehicle being used on a road which does not have the required documentation, which includes a driving licence for that class of

vehicle. Once seized by the Police it can be disposed of in accordance with force policy. The rider of the E-Scooter will also be liable for prosecution which can result in a fine, points on a driving licence or both.

Section 59 of the police reform act allows police to issue a warning if a vehicle is being used in a manner which may cause alarm, distress or annoyance. Being issued with this warning does not stop the e-scooter being seized.

Police can seize any private scooter with the likelihood the E-scooter will be disposed of accordingly if they are being used on a public road or footpath and the rider may also be liable for prosecution for traffic offences.
